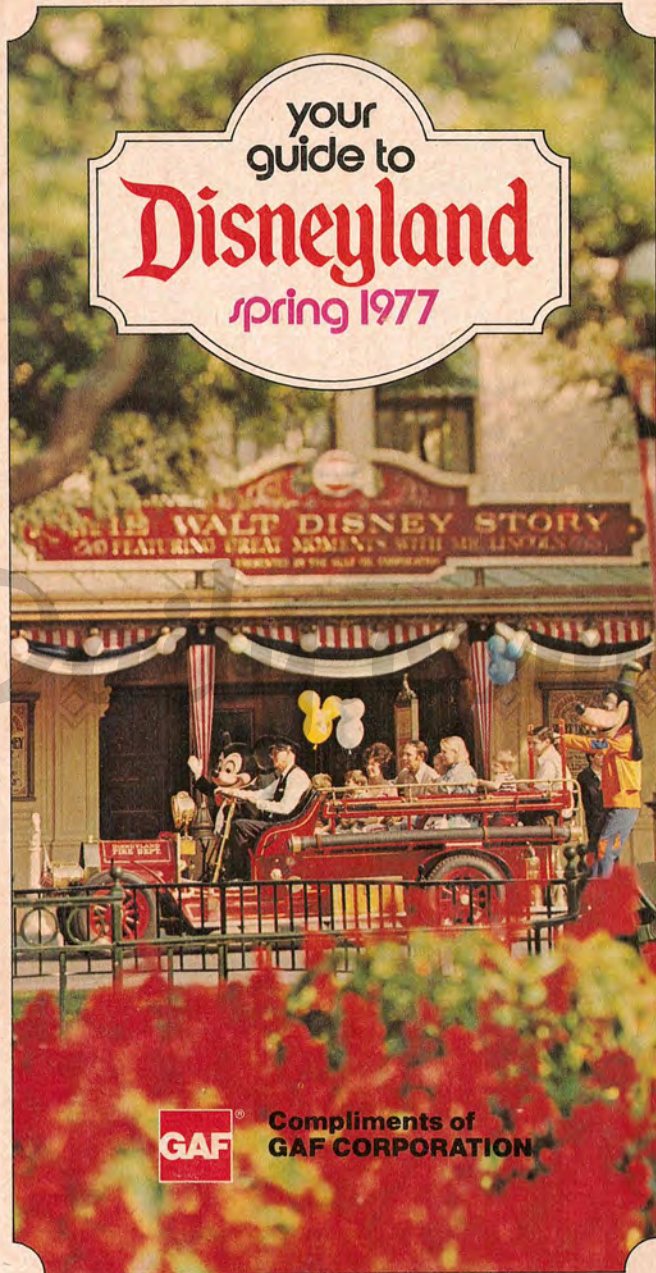

general information

General information about Disneyland may be obtained at City Hall, in Town Square. As you explore "the happiest place on earth," feel free to ask any employee for assistance.

Information about other Southern California recreational attractions and public transportation schedules may be obtained at the information center located at the corner of Main and East Plaza Streets.

GERBER BABY CENTER

Disneyland's Baby Center, presented by Gerber, is located adjacent to the First Aid Center on East Plaza Street. Facilities are provided for preparing formulas, warming bottles, breast feeding and changing infants. Sorry, babysitting is not available.

BANKAMERICARD AND MASTER CHARGE

Your BankAmericard and Master Charge card are accepted in most shops, stores and restaurants.

BANKING SERVICES

The Bank of America, located on Town Square, provides complete banking facilities. Banking hours are 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. every day Disneyland is open.

Check cashing up to \$10 in cash with proper identification is available after the Bank closes at the Main Street Railroad Station ticket booth, located on Town Square; the Adventureland ticket booth located by the Jungle Cruise; and the Fantasyland ticket booth, located in front of the Matterhorn.

Most Disneyland shops, stores and restaurants will accept a check for the amount of purchase.

CAMERA AND FILM SERVICE

Camera rental, service, and film processing are available in the Disneyland Camera Shop, in the GAF Photo Salon on Main Street. Film may be purchased at shops and merchandise stands throughout the Park. Photo-Trail signs are provided in every land to assist you in your picture-taking.

FIRST AID

Registered nurses are on duty at all times in the First Aid Center, at the end of East Plaza Street, just off Main Street.

LOCKER SERVICE

Facilities for checking purchases and garments are located in the Global Van Lines Building, between the Fire Station and Emporium on Town Square, Main Street. Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Tram Station, west of the Main Entrance.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found facilities are maintained in the Global Van Lines Building, between the Fire Station and Emporium on Town Square, Main Street.

LOST CHILDREN

Facilities for the care of lost children are maintained at the end of East Plaza Street, off Main Street. The hostess on duty will assist you.

PARK OPERATING HOURS: Effective 5/9/77 to 6/17/77

Park is open every day thru the summer season. Park hours: 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays, May 2 thru May 27 (except May 10, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.); 9 a.m. to 1 a.m. weekends, May 28, 29, June 4, 11; 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. June 5, 12; 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. May 30-June 3; 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. June 6-10; 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. June 13-17. Park operating hours subject to change without notice.

PET CARE

You may leave your pet in an airy, individual enclosure at a cost of only 50¢ for the entire day. This charge includes feeding. This facility is located to the right of the Main Gate Ticket Booths. Sorry, pets cannot be left overnight.

POSTAGE STAMPS AND MAIL SERVICE

Stamps are available in vending machines located in each land and at the Hallmark Communication Center on Main Street. Mail boxes for your letters and cards are located throughout Disneyland.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

Public telephones are located throughout Disneyland. Ask any Disneylander for directions or see the area maps.

REST ROOMS

Rest rooms are located throughout Disneyland. Refer to the area maps in this guide, or ask any Disneyland employee.

SECURITY

In most areas of the Park, Disneyland Security can be recognized by the theme area dress. If you need assistance, ask any Disneylander.

STROLLERS AND WHEELCHAIRS

Strollers and wheelchairs are available for a nominal fee, to the right just inside the Main Gate turnstiles.

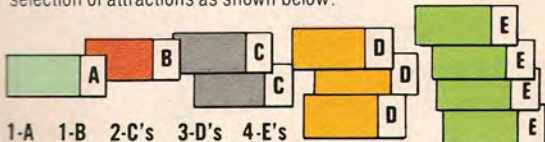
If you wish to return to Disneyland today, have your hand stamped at the Exit Gate or at the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station before leaving.

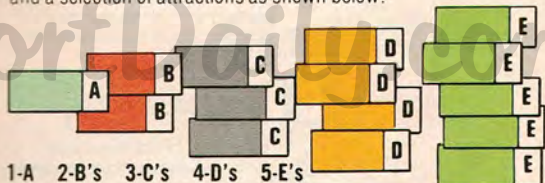

If you have already purchased a general admission ticket, or if you wish to enjoy additional adventures inside the Park, you may buy a 10-adventure book (1A, 1B, 2C, 3D, 3E) or a 5-adventure book (5E's) for \$3.75 at any central ticket booth inside the Park. Either book may be used by anyone regardless of age.

GUIDED TOUR INFORMATION

The popular Guided Tour is especially recommended for "first time guests." Visitors are taken on an exciting tour of Disneyland by a charming Guide who tells the fascinating story of the history and growth of the "happiest place on earth." The two and a half hour tour, which includes general admission plus seven of our most popular attractions, is only \$8.50 for adults and juniors, and \$5.50 for children under 12.

If you have already purchased a General Admission ticket, you may buy a Guided Tour Ticket at the Main Street Railroad Station ticket booth, located in Town Square. Tour tickets, minus main Gate admission, are \$3.00 for adults, juniors and children.

FOCUSING ON BETTER PICTURES

"BEFORE SHOOTING" CHECKLIST:

Note: If your camera is new, take pictures and have them developed before your vacation to make sure that the camera is functioning properly and that you know how to operate it.

1. Before loading, make sure camera is clean inside. If necessary, use a soft brush, a lintless cloth or tissue to clean it. To clean the lens, blow off dust first, then wipe it gently with lens tissue; use a drop of lens cleaning fluid, if available.
2. Take along plenty of fresh film (note expiration date on film box). Store film and loaded camera in a cool, dry place; never in the glove compartment, trunk, or on the rear deck of a car.
3. Carry an extra battery (if your camera needs one). Before installing, and at regular intervals thereafter, clean camera contacts and both ends of battery with rough cloth or pencil eraser.
4. Load camera in the shade, avoid direct sunlight. If no other shade is available, shield camera from sun with your body while loading.
5. Make sure you load camera properly. Check "Loading Film" section of camera instruction book.
6. On 35 mm cameras, observe rewind knob: it should revolve every time the film is advanced. If it does not revolve, reload camera, following instructions carefully.
7. Remove lens cap and make sure that fingers, camera case or strap do not block camera lens.

WHILE YOU ARE SHOOTING:

1. Hold camera level and steady. Depress shutter release with a slow, even pressure, not with a sudden push. Use a tripod and cable release, where feasible.
2. What you see in the viewfinder will be in your picture: include only what you intend to photograph. When you photograph your family in front of a large background (like the Castle), ask them to stand closer to the camera (about ten feet away) to keep them recognizable in the picture. To get into the picture yourself, use the self-timer on your camera or ask someone to take the picture for you.
3. Taking pictures in the right light is very important. Illumination is most pleasing from one hour after sunrise to 11 A.M. and from 2:30 P.M. to one hour before sunset. Take pictures with the sun at either side of the subject, where possible.
4. Keep the background simple; try to prevent objects from interfering with the outlines of the subject: a lamp post appearing to "grow out" of the head of your subject, for example, can be disturbing.

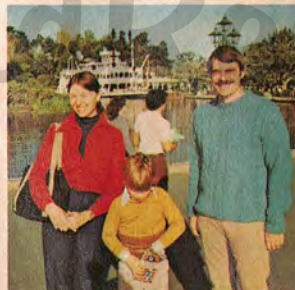


WRONG AND RIGHT WAY TO POSE SUBJECTS.

5. Let people do something, rather than just pose in front of the camera.

TIPS FOR MOVIEMAKERS:

1. Depress trigger release slowly, use a tripod (where possible) to prevent a jumpy screen image, or steady camera by placing your elbows on a firm support.
2. Use the zoom feature sparingly, only when zooming contributes to the actions.

3. Panning, moving the camera from side to side to show a large area, must be done very s-l-o-w-l-y, otherwise the image will be blurred.
4. Use fresh batteries in your movie camera. It is good practice to carry a spare set of batteries. With spring-motor cameras, wind motor after each scene.
5. Vary scene length to provide a change of pace. Optimum scene length runs from 5 to 12 seconds, depending on the subject. For subjects that require prolonged coverage (the Jungle Cruise, for example) shoot enough scenes to do the subject, but do not extend individual scenes beyond approximately 10 seconds.

WHEN YOU GET HOME:

1. Have films developed immediately.
2. Whether you show prints, slides, or a movie, organize your material before showing it. Arrange pictures, slides, and edit film footage according to subject (Adventureland, Fantasyland, Tomorrowland, etc.), eliminate repetition and portions that are unsatisfactory (blurred, over- or underexposed, etc.). Prevent audience boredom by showing only your best efforts and by keeping the show varied, interesting, and short.

Note: Flash photography is not permitted in most Disneyland indoor attractions.
