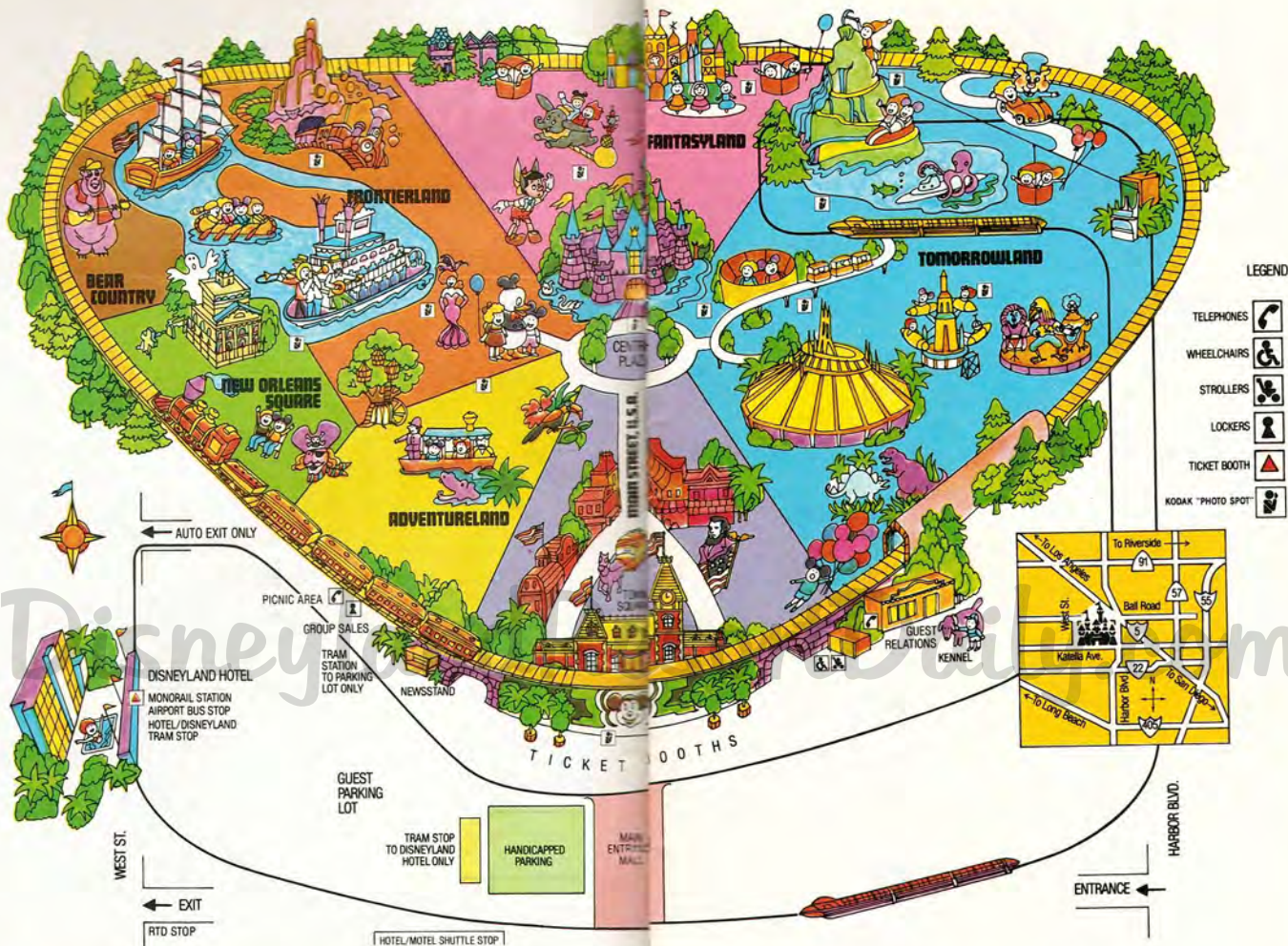

Disneyland general information may be obtained from CITY HALL, Town Square (messages may be left for lost guests). General information about other Southern California recreational attractions and public transportation schedules may be obtained from CAREFREE CORNER at the end of Main Street.

During your visit, feel free to ask any employee for assistance.

American Express

Your American Express card is the official credit card of the Magic Kingdom and is accepted in many shops, stores and restaurants.

Baby Center presented by Gerber

Located between Coke Corner and the First Aid Center, Main Street. Facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, breast feeding and changing

infants. Baby food available. Disposable diapers and baby food also available at Main Street Market House. Sorry, babysitting not available.

Banking Services

The Bank of America, located on Town Square, provides complete banking facilities from 10 AM to 3 PM every day Disneyland is open. Check cashing up to \$20 in cash with proper identification is available after the bank closes at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and the Starcade in Tomorrowland.

Most Disneyland shops, stores and restaurants will accept travelers and personal checks, with proper identification, for the amount of purchase only.

First Aid Center

Registered nurse on duty at all times. Located at the end of Main Street, next to the Plaza Inn.

Locker Service presented by National Car Rental

Facilities for checking purchases and garments are located between the Fire Station and the Emporium on Town Square, Main Street.

Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram Station, west of Disneyland's Main Gate Ticket Booths.

Lost and Found

Facilities for lost and found items are furnished between the Emporium and the Fire Station on Town Square, Main Street.

Lost Children

Facilities for the care of lost children are maintained within the First Aid Center at the end of Main Street, next to the Plaza Inn.

Handicapped Guests

Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland for our disabled guests. For specific information please be sure to get a copy of our Handicapped Information Guide at Carefree Corner or Wheelchair and Stroller Center.

Disneyland Tickets

Select your favorite way to enjoy Disneyland. There are several ways to enjoy the Magic Kingdom, each designed to fit your individual needs.

Passports and Guided Tour tickets may be purchased at the Main Gate Ticket Booths and the Monorail Station at the Disneyland Hotel. You will need Passports for children (ages 3-12) and adults. Children 2 and under are free.

Unlimited Passports

The one, two or three-day Passport gives unlimited use of Disneyland adventures and attractions (except Arcades), with one convenient ticket that's your Passport to fun.

Guided Tours

Recommended for "first-time guests" and the visitor with a limited amount of time. The Guided Tour of Disneyland is your key to the seven realms of the Magic Kingdom. On the three hour tour, you will experience several of our exciting attractions and discover little-known facts about Disneyland — its history and its creator, Walt Disney. Multi-lingual tours (subject to availability) and advance reservations are available by calling (714) 999-4573. Handicapped guests are welcome on Guided Tour. Unlimited Passport not included in Guided Tour ticket.

Senior Fun Days

Any Senior, age 60 or over, can purchase a special Unlimited Passport at a reduced price every Thursday and Friday. Ask at the Ticket Booth for details.

Insiders' Tips on Making Your Visit More Pleasant

These suggestions will help save time, energy and footsteps while you enjoy all there is to see and do during your visit to Disneyland.

Attractions

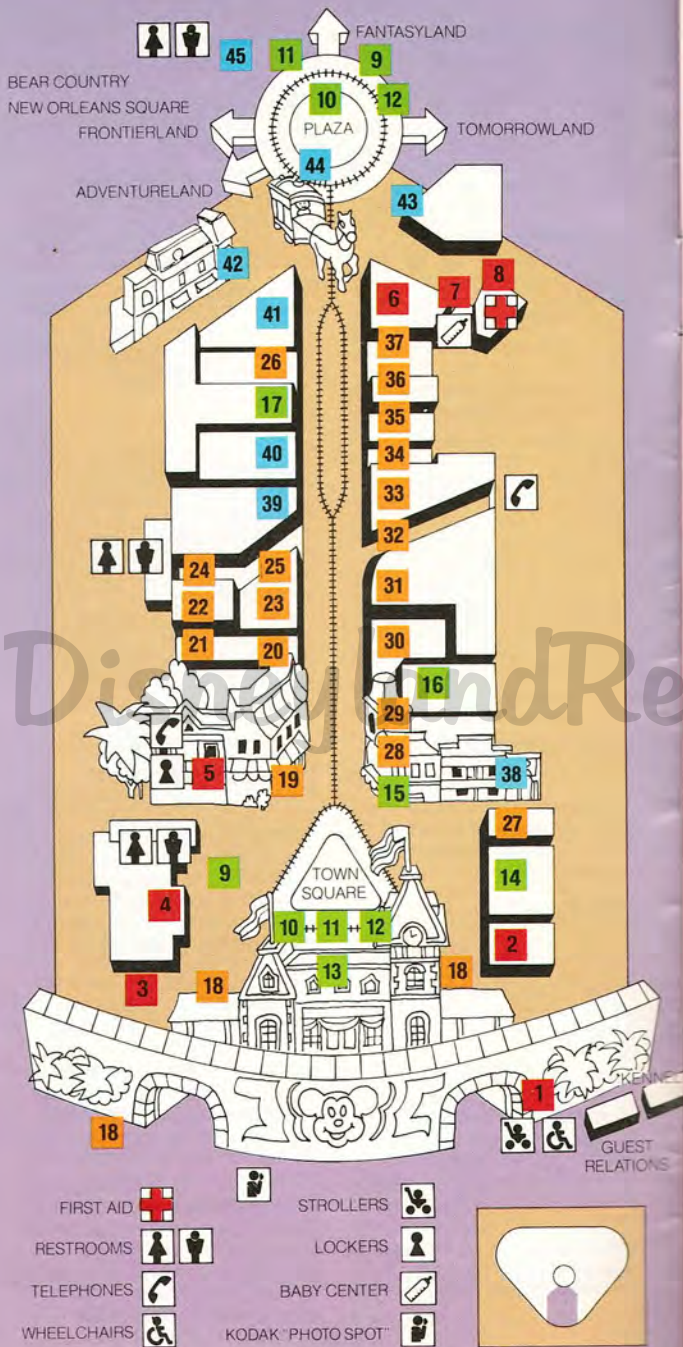
No matter what the season, the best time to see our most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) or just before Park closing. Let the descriptions listed on pages 5-19 help you decide which attractions you wish to see. We suggest you begin with a train trip around the Magic Kingdom, and then proceed to the attractions of your choice using the inside map as a guide. Your Passport will enable you to experience a variety of attractions and adventures.

Re-Entry to Disneyland

If you wish to leave Disneyland and return during normal Park operating hours on the same day, you must have your hand stamped at the exit turnstiles. You may re-enter the parking lot, free of charge, during normal Park operating hours on the same day if you retain your parking ticket and present it at the Parking Lot Entrance upon your return. Disneyland Hotel guests and visitors, exiting by way of the Disneyland Monorail, must also have their hands stamped as they exit the Monorail to obtain re-entry during normal Park operating hours on the same day.

Disney Characters

Disney Characters may appear at many different locations throughout the Park. They have no specific schedule. So, keep your eyes open, they could surprise you at any time!

Kodak Picture Tips

1. For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently squeeze the shutter release.

2. Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.

3. Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.

4. You may want to capture interesting details of subjects by moving in close. With the close-up setting on some Kodak disc cameras you can get as close as 18 inches.

5. To help make a complete picture story, take photographs at the "Photo Spot" signs throughout Disneyland.

6. Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.

7. For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera.

8. Concentrate attention on your main subject by moving in close enough for it to fill the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for the minimum subject distance).

9. For natural pictures of people have them involved in a fun activity rather than staring at the camera.
