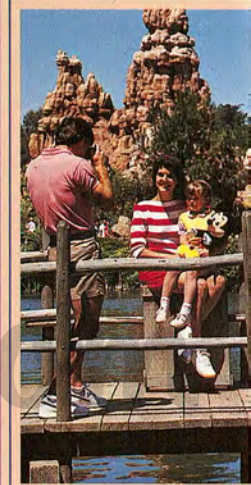

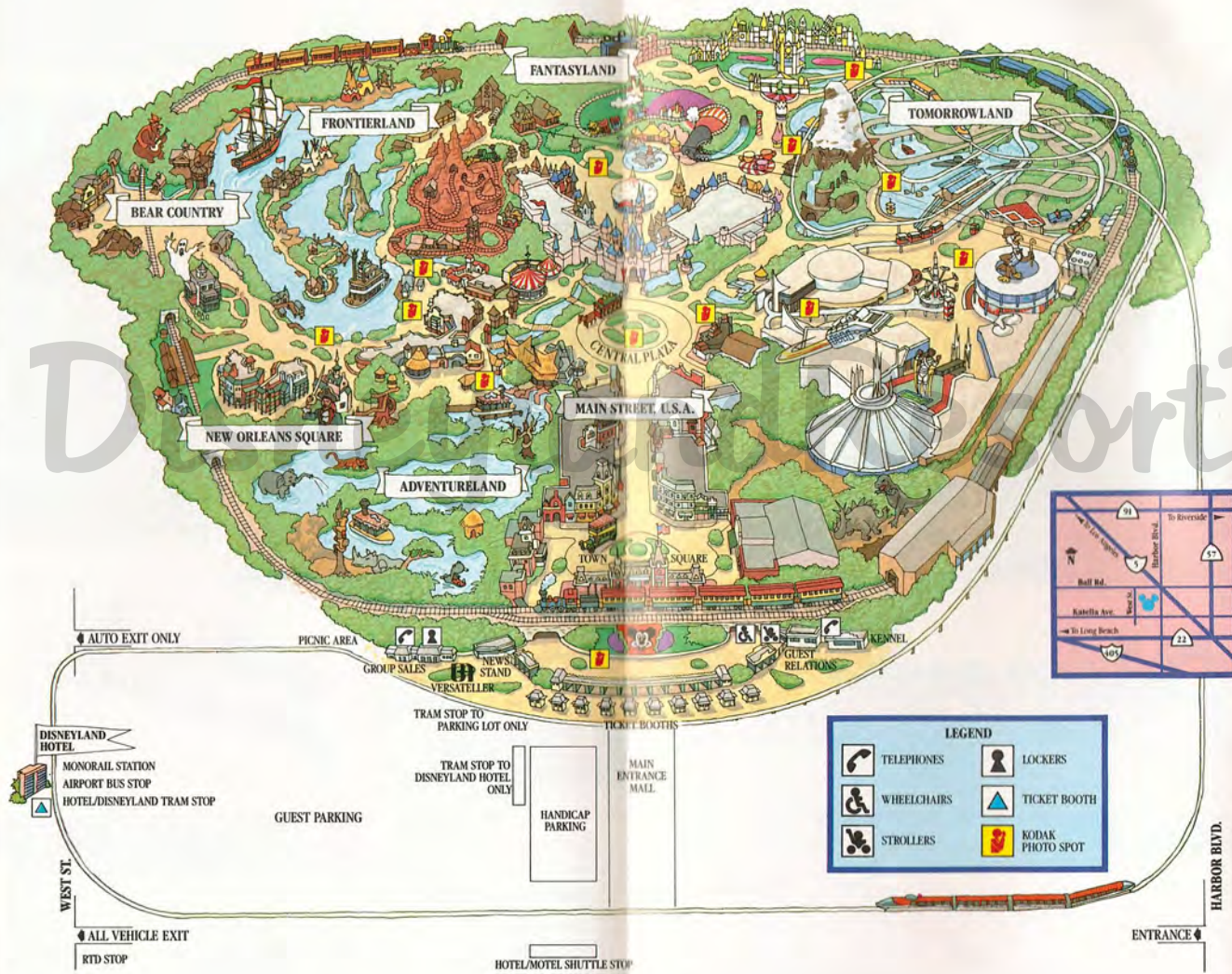

In Disneyland, general information may be obtained at **City Hall** on the west side of Town Square. Information about public transportation (including schedules) and other Southern California attractions is available at **Card Corner** on the east end of Main Street.

If you need information or assistance during your visit, feel free to ask any Disneyland Cast member. He or she will be more than glad to help you.

Disneyland Tickets and Passports

One-, Two- and Three-Day Disneyland Passports and Child Passports (for ages 3-12) provide unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except Arcades) and may be purchased at any Main Entrance Ticket Booth or at the Monorail Station at the Disneyland Hotel.

Major credit cards are accepted. Children two and under are admitted free. Children under seven must be accompanied by an adult on all attractions.

Guided Tours

Guided Tours are

recommended for first-time guests and those with a limited amount of time, although return visitors to Disneyland may enjoy the tours as well. During the three-and-a-half-hour tour, which is presented by a Disneyland host or hostess, guests will experience several attractions and discover little known facts about Walt Disney and the Magic Kingdom.

Foreign language tours are offered (subject to availability). Advance



reservations for groups of 15 or more are suggested. Please call (714) 999-4573. Handicapped guests are welcome on Guided Tours. The Guided Tours ticket, which is not included in the unlimited use Passport, is also available for purchase at City Hall.



Note: Length of tour may vary depending on wait time for attractions.

Senior Fun Passports
A reduced-price Passport is available to those 60 and over every Monday through

Friday from September to June.

3-Season Passport

A specially priced Passport that provides unlimited admission to Disneyland and use of all adventures and attractions during January, May and September for a period of one year.

Annual Passport

The keys to the Kingdom, the Disneyland Annual Passport gives the holder unlimited admission to Disneyland and use of all adventures and attractions, plus free parking, for one year.

Ticket media and programs subject to change without notice.

American Express

American Express is the Official Credit Card of Disneyland and is accepted at the Main Entrance and in many of the shops, stores and restaurants.

Banking Services

Bank of America, located on the east side of Town Square, provides complete banking services from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily. A Versateller is located west of the Disneyland Main Entrance. Checks up to \$20 can be cashed with proper identification at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and the Starcade in Tomorrowland.

Most Disneyland shops and restaurants accept traveler's checks and

personal checks with proper identification. Personal checks may be written for the amount of purchase only.

Most shops will ship or mail your purchased items, if you so desire.

First Aid

First Aid is located at the east end of Main Street next to the Plaza Inn. A registered nurse is on duty at all times.

Handicapped Guests

Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland for disabled guests. For specific information, obtain a copy of the **Disneyland Handicap Guest Guide** at Card Corner or Strollers and Wheelchairs.

Kennels presented by Gaines

Pets may be boarded in the Disneyland Kennel, which is east of the Disneyland Main Entrance. Sorry, pets cannot be kept overnight.

Lost and Found

Lost items may be claimed at Lost and Found, located on the west side of Town Square between the Emporium and the Fire Station.

Lost Children

Facilities for the care of lost children are maintained at First Aid. Lost child inquiries are handled at City Hall.

Baby Center presented by Gerber

Located on the east end of Main Street between Card Corner and First Aid, the Baby Center provides facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, breast-feeding and changing diapers. Disposable diapers and a limited selection of baby food are also available at the Market House on Main Street. Sorry, baby-sitting is not available.

Storage Lockers presented by National Car Rental

Lockers for storing garments, personal belongings and purchases are located within Lost and Found.

Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram stop, west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

Strollers and Wheelchairs

Stroller and wheelchair rentals are available for a nominal charge and



refundable deposit. Located on the east side of the Disneyland Main Entrance, just inside the gate.

Please Note: Shoes and sbirts must be worn at all times in Disneyland. We request that no food or beverages be brought into Disneyland. A picnic area is located west of the Main Entrance for your convenience. Also, for the sake of those around you, we request that there be no flash photography, eating, drinking or smoking in any attraction. We thank you for your cooperation and consideration.

Tips to make your visit more pleasant

Here are a few suggestions to save you time and energy, thus enabling you to enjoy your day at Disneyland to the fullest:

Attractions

No matter what the season, the best time to see the most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) and just before closing.

Also, plan on eating your meals early or late so you'll avoid the lunch and dinner rushes.

If you plan to do some shopping, don't hold off until the end of the day. The shops are usually at their busiest at that time.

The descriptions on pages 7-22 will help you decide what attractions you'd like to see, where you want to eat and which shops you'd like to browse through.

We suggest you begin your day with a trip on the Disneyland Railroad and then proceed to the attractions you wish to visit. The map on the inside cover is a helpful guide.

No tickets are required on any attraction: your Passport provides unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except arcades).

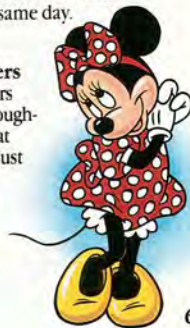
Re-entry to Disneyland

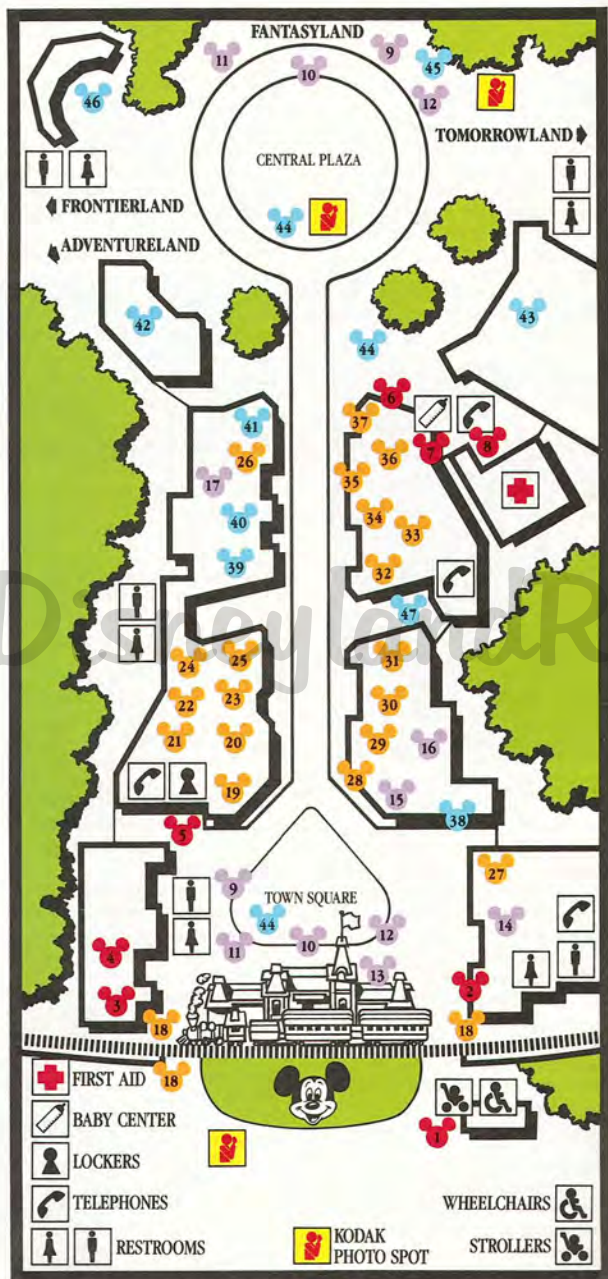
If you wish to leave Disneyland and return the same day during regular operating hours, you must have your hand stamped at the exit turnstiles. You may also reenter the parking lot on the same day (free of charge) if you retain your parking ticket and present it at the Guest Parking Entrance.

Disneyland Hotel guests and visitors, leaving by way of the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station, must have their hands stamped as they exit the station if they plan to return to Disneyland the same day.

Disney Characters

- 12 Omnibus**
Take in all the sights on Main Street from atop this double-decker bus.

A grand circle tour of Disneyland with visits to the Grand Canyon and Primeval World. Stops in Frontierland and Tomorrowland.

Kodak Picture Tips for Disneyland.

1 For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently press the shutter release.

2 Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.



3 Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.

4 For natural pictures of people have them involved in a fun



activity rather than staring at the camera.

5 Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.

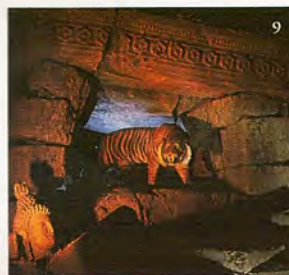
6 Concentrate attention on your main subject by moving in close enough for it to fill the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for the minimum subject distance).



7 You may want to capture interesting details of subjects by moving in close. With the close-up setting on some Kodak disc cameras you can get as close as 18 inches.

8 For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera. Flashes are not functional for subjects beyond 50 feet, such as fireworks.

9 If you have a 35mm camera, you can photograph outdoor subjects after sundown and indoor subjects using fast films, such as KODACOLOR VR 400 Films (set exposure meter at 400) and KODACOLOR VR 1000 Films (set exposure meter at 1000).
