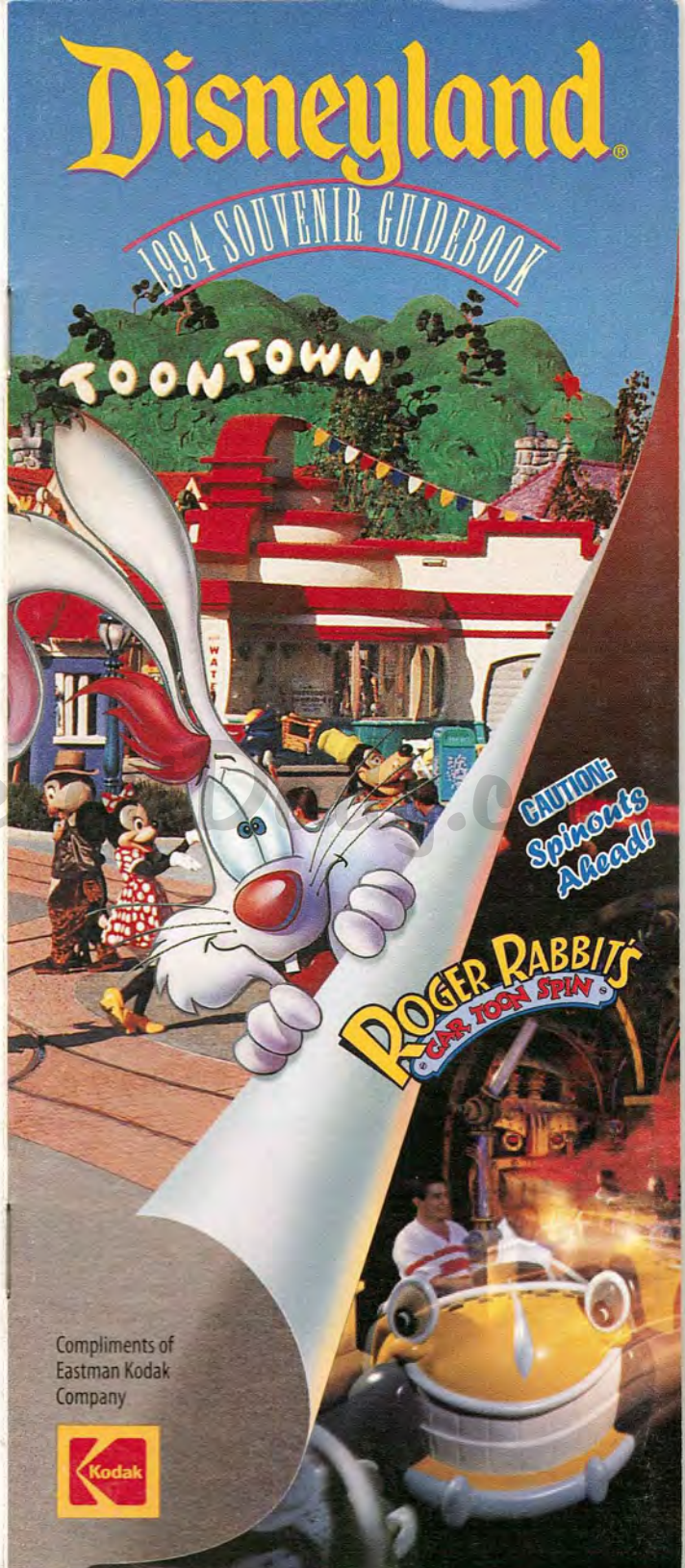

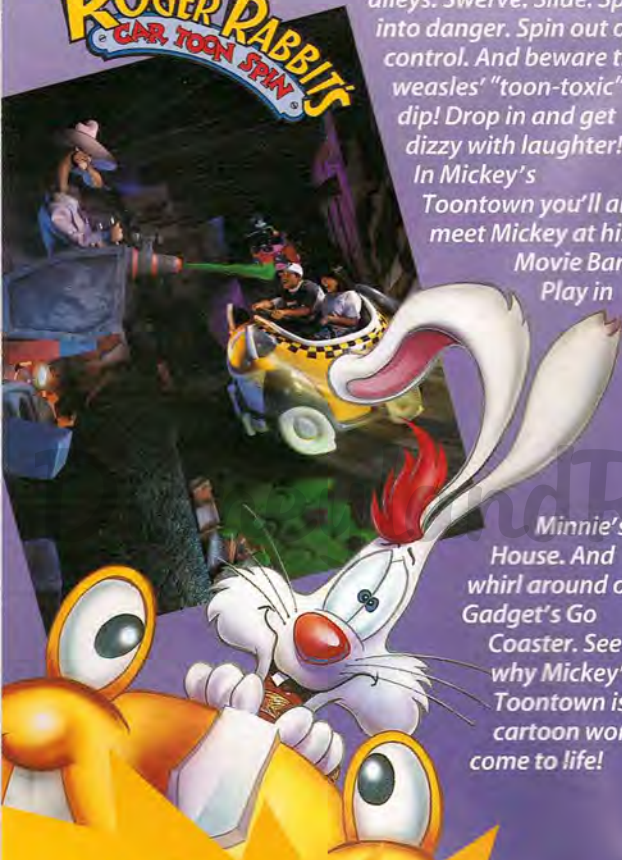

Information about public transportation (including schedules) and other Southern California attractions is available at Carefree Corner on the east end of Main Street.

If you need assistance during your visit, feel free to ask any Disneyland Cast Member. He or she will be more than glad to help you.

For further information about hours, entertainment events, and Passports and ticket prices, write or call Disneyland Guest Relations, P.O. Box 3232, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714) 999-4565.

Disneyland Tickets and Passports

Purchase your One-, Two- or Three-Day Disneyland Passports and Child Passports (for ages 3-11) at any Main Entrance ticket booth. Visa, MasterCard and American Express are accepted. Children two and under are admitted free.

Each Passport provides unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except Arcades). Young children should be accompanied by an adult on all attractions.

Senior Fun Passport

If you are a senior 60 or over, you may purchase a reduced-price Passport any day of the week. Additional discounts are available through the Magic Years Club, which offers travel and leisure benefits to seniors. For more information, write or call Disney's Magic Years Club, P.O. Box 4709, Anaheim, CA 92803, (714) 490-3250.

Seasonal Passport

The Seasonal Passport gives you admission to Disneyland and use of all attractions (except Arcades) during selected seasonal periods. Check with Disneyland Guest Relations for complete details.

Annual Passport

The Disneyland Annual Passport, good during regular operating hours, offers you unlimited admission to Disneyland, use of all attractions (except Arcades), plus free parking for one year.

Ticket media and programs subject to change without notice.

Guided Tours

If it's your first time to Disneyland, or you have a limited amount of time, we'd like to recommend our three-and-a-half-hour guided tour. Discover little-known facts about Walt Disney and his Magic Kingdom and experience several attractions with your Disneyland Host or Hostess.

Foreign language tours are offered (subject to availability). Advance reservations for groups of 15 or more are suggested. Please call (714) 999-4573. The Guided Tour ticket, which is not included in the unlimited use Passport, is available for purchase at City Hall and at the Main Entrance ticket booths.

Note: Length of tour may vary depending on wait time for attractions. Guests with disabilities are welcome.

Birthday Parties

You may celebrate a birthday at Disneyland with Characters, birthday cake, ice cream, party favors and special surprises for the birthday person at The Space Place in Tomorrowland. Advance reservations are recommended or you may inquire at The Space Place on the day of your visit for space availability.

Disney Dollars

Use Disney Dollars for all your buying needs throughout Disneyland and the Disneyland Hotel. Disney Dollars are available in \$1, \$5, and \$10 denominations at a one-for-one exchange rate with U.S. currency. Disney Dollars may be purchased at all ticket booths, City Hall, the Newsstand, the Penny Arcade, Disneyana, Disney Showcase, Carefree Corner, Carriage Place, the Emporium jewelry counter on Main Street, Tinker Bell Toy Shoppe, The Star Trader, Premiere Shop and at the Starcade. They are also available at the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station and at the front desk of the Disneyland Hotel. Cash in on the fun!

Reservations

Reservations are available for selected Disneyland and Disneyland Hotel restaurants as well as Disneyland shows on a limited basis at the Guest Relations Reservations Center located in the exit lobby of The Walt Disney Story on Main Street. Open on selected weekends and seasonal periods only.

American Express

American Express is the Official Credit Card of Disneyland and is accepted at the Main Entrance and in many of the shops, stores and restaurants.

Bank of Main Street

Cash advances, check cashing and currency exchanges are available. Open daily until 1 p.m. Cash advances are available at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and at the Starcade in Tomorrowland. Stop in for general Disneyland information. Also, the photo processing location for annual pass holders.

Merchandise Services

With proper identification, you may cash checks up to \$20 at the Penny Arcade on Main Street and the Starcade in Tomorrowland. Most Disneyland shops and restaurants accept cash, Disney Dollars, major credit cards, traveler's checks and personal checks with proper identification. Personal checks may be written for the amount of purchase only.

We offer a merchandise package pick-up service at the Group Sales Window located just outside the Park gates to the west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

A wide variety of Disneyland merchandise is available by mail order through our Merchandise Guest Services Department. For more information, write or call Merchandise Guest Services, P.O. Box 3232, Anaheim, CA 92803 (800) 362-4533.


Guests of the Disneyland Hotel may have their merchandise purchases delivered to their rooms free of charge. Please ask a Merchandise Host/Hostess for details.


First Aid

First Aid is located at the east end of Main Street next to the Plaza Inn. A registered nurse is on duty at all times.

Special Services for Guests with Disabilities

Accommodations have been made throughout Disneyland for guests with disabilities. For specific information, obtain your copy of the Disneyland **Disabled Guest Guide** at Carefree Corner or Strollers and Wheelchairs.

In this guidebook, this wheelchair symbol  indicates areas where you may remain in your wheelchair at all times.

Some attractions require that you be able to leave your wheelchair.  A member of your party is necessary to assist you in and out of these attractions.

Stroller and Wheelchair Rentals

A limited number of stroller and wheelchair rentals are available for a nominal charge and refundable deposit. They are located on the east side of the Disneyland Main Entrance, just inside the gate.

Kennel Club, hosted by Friskies

Board your pets for a nominal charge in the Disneyland Kennel, which is east of the Disneyland Main Entrance. Sorry, no facilities for overnight accommodations.

Lost and Found

Claim your lost items at Lost and Found, located on the east side of Main Street, around the corner from the Market House.

Lost Children

Pick up your lost child at the Lost Children Center, located at the east end of Main Street next to First Aid. You can also make inquiries at City Hall.

Baby Care Center, hosted by Carnation Infant Formula

Located on the east end of Main Street between Carefree Corner and First Aid, the Baby Care Center provides facilities for preparing formulas, warming bottles, nursing and changing diapers. Disposable diapers and a limited selection of baby food are also available at the Market House on Main Street. Sorry, baby-sitting is not available.



Storage Lockers

A limited number of lockers for storing garments, personal belongings and purchases are located adjacent to Lost and Found, halfway down Main Street next to the Main Street Cone Shop, and next to the Videopolis rest rooms.

Lockers large enough for suitcases are located near the Parking Lot Tram stop, west of the Disneyland Main Entrance.

Tips to make your visit more pleasant.

Enjoy your day at Disneyland to the fullest with these time, and energy-saving suggestions:

Attractions

No matter what the season, the best time to see the most popular attractions is early in the day (before noon) and just before closing.

Also, plan on dining early or late so you'll avoid the lunch and dinner rushes.

If you plan to do some shopping, don't wait until the end of the day. The shops are usually the busiest at that time.

The descriptions on pages 6-29 will help you decide what attractions you'd like to see, where you might want to eat and which shops you'd like to browse through. The Park map on the inside is a helpful guide.

No tickets are required on any attraction: your Passport provides unlimited use of all adventures and attractions (except Arcades).

Safety Considerations

Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times in Disneyland. We request that no food or beverages be brought into Disneyland. A picnic area is located west of the Main Entrance for your convenience. Also, for the comfort of those around you, we request that there be no flash photography, eating or drinking in any attractions. **Smoking is not permitted in any attraction, waiting area, shop or restaurant.**

Attention young at heart! Splash Mountain, Space Mountain, Star Tours, Matterhorn Bobsleds, Gadget's Go Coaster, Big Thunder Mountain Railroad and Autopia have boarding restrictions. Guests should be in good health and free from heart, back or neck problems, motion sickness or other conditions that could be aggravated by these adventures. Expectant mothers and children under 3 should not ride. See a Host or Hostess at these attractions for more information. For your safety and convenience at parade time, please honor designated parade viewing areas and use designated crosswalks.

Reentry to Disneyland

If you wish to leave Disneyland and return the same day during regular operating hours, a valid Disneyland Passport and a hand stamp are required for re-admission. You may also reenter the Parking Lot on the same day (free of charge) if you retain your parking ticket and present it at the Guest Parking Entrance.

Are you a visitor or guest of the Disneyland Hotel leaving by way of the Disneyland Hotel Monorail Station? You must have a valid Disneyland Passport and a hand stamp as you exit the station if you plan to return to Disneyland the same day.

Disney Characters

Mickey Mouse can be found filming movies in his Movie Barn at Mickey's Toontown. Most of his pals can be found strolling the neighborhood as well as Town Square and the Central Plaza area. Just keep your eyes open and your camera ready.

Photo Processing by Fox Photo

Drop off your film at various locations throughout the Park and at the Disneyland Hotel for two-hour or next-day processing by Fox Photo. You may pick up your prints at the Camera Center on Main Street or in the Monorail Plaza at the Disneyland Hotel.

DISNEYLAND PARK

A TREASURE CHEST OF TRIVIA

What follows is a collection of little-known facts, historical items and odd curiosities that can be found throughout the lands of Disneyland Park.

Main Street, U.S.A.

- The ornate base of the Town Square flagpole was discovered in 1955 on Wilshire Blvd. at the scene of a traffic accident - a car had run into a lamppost and the base was bought for \$5.00. The flag pole is 65 feet high.
- The cannons in Town Square were built by Hutchkiss in Paris, France. They were used by the French Army in the 19th Century.
- The street lamps on Main Street are 150 years old. They were purchased in Baltimore, Maryland, for three cents a pound.
- The Disneyland Railroad engines, the C.K. Holliday, E.P. Ripley, Ernest S. Marsh and the Fred Gurley, were all named after the founder and executives of the Santa Fe Railroad.
- The engine of the first train in the Park was a larger scale reproduction of Walt's toy engine, the "Lilly Belle" (named after Walt's wife, Lillian).
- The nickelodeon in the Penny Arcade is a replica of a Welte Sohne Grikeburg I/B Orchestron which was built in the late 19th century. It plays everything from waltzes to ragtime. The music is created by mean of perforated paper roles.
- Abraham Lincoln's speech in *Great Moments With Mr. Lincoln* is actually a composite of portions of various speeches delivered by the Great Emancipator.

Adventureland

- Original plans for the portions of the Jungle Cruise called for real wild animals, but zoologists warned Walt that the animals would always be asleep during operating hours.
- José the Macaw, star of the *Enchanted Tiki Room*, used to sit on a perch above the entrance to Adventureland greeting guests. But he was soon removed because he proved too popular and created crowd congestion at the entrance.
- The fabricated tree that houses the *Swiss Family Treehouse* is a very rare "species" know as a "Disneydendron."
- Harper Goff, a scenic designer at Walt Disney Imagineering, based many of the visual elements of *The Jungle Cruise* attraction (especially the boats) upon the famous Humphrey Bogart, Katharine Hepburn film, *The African Queen*.

New Orleans Square

- Facial designs for the figures in the *Pirates of the Caribbean* were modeled after staff members at Walt Disney Imagineering.
- The One-of-a-Kind shop was inspired by Mrs. Walt Disney's love of antiques.

Critter Country

- The Indian Burial Ground on Tom Sawyer Island was originally located in the old Indian Village (present site of Critter Country).
- The current site of *Splash Mountain* was formerly the den of a snoring, hibernating bear named Rufus.
- Critter Country was formerly called Bear Country (1972-1988).

Opening Day

- Disneyland opened on July 17, 1955, with 18 attractions. Today there are 60 adventures throughout the Park, including the latest, Roger Rabbit's Car Toon Spin.
- The Disneyland Hotel debuted amidst orange groves on October 5, 1955, with just 100 rooms. The resort now offers 1,131 rooms on 60 acres.

Strolling Through The Park.

- Main Street, U.S.A. is a composite of small-town America circa 1900. Modeled after Walt Disney's boyhood hometown of Marceline, Missouri.
- The undersea vessels of the Submarine Voyage in Tomorrowland were constructed in 1959 at a shipyard in San Pedro, California, and trucked via flatbed to the lagoon in Tomorrowland.
- Three Disneyland attractions were originally presented at the 1964 World's Fair in New York-It's a Small World, Great Moments with Mr. Lincoln and Primeval World.
- The debut in 1963 of the singing birds, tikis and flowers of the Enchanted Tiki Room marked the first use of "Audio-Animatronics® technology."
- The Matterhorn Mountain is 147 feet tall, exactly 1/100 the size of the real Matterhorn in Switzerland. Additionally, the slopes and distinctive peak of the Disney version are identically aligned to the positioning of the original.
- In 1961, the Disneyland Monorail System was extended by 2 1/2 miles to reach the Disneyland Hotel, the first time such a system was linked to a resort.
- The land-line telegraph signal emanating from the office at the Frontierland Train Station is actually transmitting Walt Disney's opening day dedication speech for Disneyland.
- Walt's father, Elais Disney, participated as a building contractor on the construction of the Mark Twain steamboat in Frontierland.
- Dust and cobwebs are created by Disney special-effects experts in the Haunted Mansion to compensate for air conditioning suction.

The Disneyland Cast

- During the height of the summer season, the combined staff of Disneyland and the Disneyland Hotel totals more than 11,000 men and women. Winter season employees number 7,600.
- There are 500 arts, crafts, professions and skills contributed by Disneyland Cast Members to the operations of the Magic Kingdom.
- There more than 500,000 pieces of clothing in the Disneyland costume inventory. Besides costumes for thousands of Cast Members, clothing is maintained for over 1,100 "Audio-Animatronics figures" that preform daily in Park attractions.

Landscaping

- There are 800 species of plants from 40 nations represented in the Park and Hotel. Trees range in size from one-foot, 150-year old lodgepole pines to 75-foot-tall pine trees.
- One orange tree remains from the vast acres of groves cleared during the 1950s to make way for the Park and Hotel. It is located in the Oriental Gardens area of the Disneyland Hotel.

KODAK PICTURE TIPS FOR Disneyland.

1 For sharp pictures, hold your camera steady as you gently press the shutter release.

2 Add a feeling of depth to your pictures by "framing" the subject with a foreground object such as an arch or tree branch.



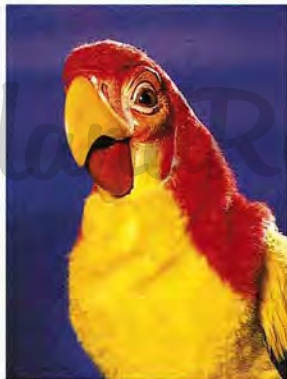
3 Personalize your pictures by including friends or family members in the foreground.

4 For natural pictures of people have them involved in fun activity rather than staring at the camera.



5 Make title pictures for your picture story by photographing identifying signs.

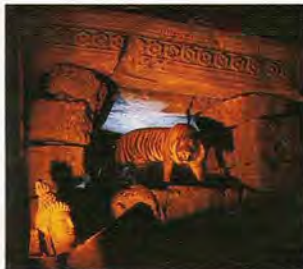
6 Concentrate on your subject by moving in close, filling the entire viewfinder (check your camera manual for minimum subject distance). Or capture interesting details with a telephoto lens or Kodak FunSaver Telephoto 35 camera.



7 When the action or a scenic view is larger than your regular camera can handle, try a wide angle lens or the Kodak FunSaver Panoramic 35 camera.

8 For good flash pictures be sure to keep your subject within the flash distance range for your camera. Flashes are not functional for subjects beyond 50 feet, such as fireworks.

9 When light is low and a flash is inappropriate, you can use fast films such as Kodak Gold Plus 400 or 1600 films.

200 Kodak Gold Super 200 film is a multi-purpose film for sunny or overcast days. *Examples: Central Plaza, Tom Sawyer Island, Big Thunder Ranch.*

400 Kodak Gold Ultra 400 film is an enhanced multi-purpose film for a wider range of light and action. Great clear shots of movement or low light conditions. Ideal for use with flash. *Examples: Walk-through exhibits at The Walt Disney Story, Mark Twain Riverboat, Sailing Ship Columbia.*

1600 Kodak Gold 1600 film is for extremely low light or very fast action. *Examples: Swiss Family Treehouse, Meet Mickey at his Movie Barn in Toontown, Marching Bands and Stage Bands.*
